**Name:** *QuestBridge College Match program*  
**Deadline:** September 30, 2007  
**Type:** Non-profit service to low-income students  
**Details:** Recipients of National College Match scholarships are granted admission to one of QuestBridge's partner schools along with a full scholarship covering all four years of college:  
➤ Full cost of tuition (\$23,000 - \$36,000 per year, depending on college)  
➤ Full cost of room and board (\$7,000 - \$11,000 per year, depending on the college)  
Qualified low-income QuestBridge applicants who are not awarded College Match scholarships can also apply to partner colleges for free through the regular admissions process.

**Name:** *Boston University Latin scholarship*  
**Deadline:** October 20, 2007  
**Details:** For the fourteenth consecutive year, the Boston University Latin Scholarship recognizes students who have a serious interest in classical languages, culture, and history. The competition consists of a two-hour examination held at Boston University. The exam challenges students to demonstrate their knowledge of Latin and the history and culture of ancient Rome. **Name:** *2008 Horatio Alger Scholarship*

**Deadline:** October 30, 2007

**Details:** Eligibility criteria:

- Enrolled full time as a high school senior, graduating in spring/summer 2008, with plans to enter college in the US no later than the fall 2008
- Pursuing a **bachelor's degree** at an accredited institution (may start at a 2-year institution and transfer to a 4-year)
- Critical financial need, preferably \$50,000 or less adjusted gross income/family
- Involvement in co-curricular and community service activities
- Minimum GPA of a 2.0
- US Citizen or permanent resident. Must reside in the US.

**Type:** Merit scholarships  
**Details:** For the 2007-2008 admissions year.  
Eligibility factors:  
➤ Class rank - in general students will rank in the top 15% of their class.  
➤ Test Scores - combined critical reading and math SAT score of 1300 or better or an ACT composite score of 30 or better.

**Name:** *Arcadia University Merit-Based Scholarships*

**Deadline:** January 15, 2008 (Distinguished Scholarship)

March 1, 2008 (Achievement Award)

**Details:** **The Arcadia University Distinguished Scholarship**

This award recognizes academic excellence, outstanding leadership, and community and volunteer service. Freshman awards range from \$11,000 to \$15,000 annually for new students entering in fall of 2007 or spring of 2008. High school seniors are evaluated on the basis of their grades, SAT/ACT scores, types of coursework taken, high school rank and involvement. There is not a separate application for these awards. All students that apply for full-time admission will be considered.

**The Arcadia University Achievement Award**

This award recognizes exceptional participation in school activities, community service, volunteer work or special talents. Higher level award amounts (\$8,000-\$12,000) also reflect academic achievements or standardized test scores. Achievement Awards range from \$4,000 to \$48,000 over four years (or, from \$1,000 to \$12,000 per year). Like the Distinguished Scholarship, students are automatically considered for an Achievement Award upon applying to the University. No separate application is necessary. The award is renewable each year provided the student remains a full-time undergraduate in good academic standing. Additionally, prospective Fine Arts majors may receive an Achievement Award based on the quality of their portfolio review and prospective B.F.A. in Acting majors may receive one based on their audition.

**Details:** The C.W. Post Biomedical Sciences Scholarship is available to new freshman who desire to study full-time within the Medical Biology programs of the Department of Biomedical Sciences at the undergraduate level. Up to two scholarship participants receive a \$2,000 annual award toward tuition, which is renewable, each year (with an overall 3.0 GPA) for a maximum total of \$8,000 toward a Bachelor's degree.

- SAT composite of 1500
- All scholarship recipients must apply and be accepted as full-time undergraduate matriculated students for the 2008-2009 academic year at C.W.
