Name: **Anna M. Vincent Scholarship Trust**

Deadline: March 1, 2008

4. Financial need may be considered.
5. A letter is to be written, by the student candidate, explaining why they are interested in agriculture.

7. Letters of recommendation are to be submitted.

9. The deadline for accepting applications is May 1st.
10. The amount of the scholarship in 2008 will be \$2,500
11. In addition, a plaque will be presented to the recipient.
12. The scholarship check will be made out in whatever fashion the trustee deems necessary, for best use by the recipient.
13. The committee will meet as often as necessary, to discuss and consider possible recipients. The responsibility of selecting the recipient rests solely with this committee.
14. Selection will be made by the committee members.
15. The recipient's name is to be withheld until the scholarship is presented.
16. It is preferred that all information regarding the student applicant, be received at one time. Please do not use staples. Paper clips are acceptable.
